Think back to your first few days driving. Remember learning with your parents? Trying to figure out the right amount of pressure to use on the pedals? Not knowing when to use the brakes for the Stop Sign? Re-

member your first time on the interstate? The fears of the 18-Wheeler as he barreled pass you? All the while the people in the other cars having no idea that you just received your license.

A new program is trying to change that fear in Georgia. The Caution and Courtesy Driver Alliance is a non-profit alliance working with government agencies and other teen driver advocates aimed at making driving in Georgia safer for our newly licensed, inexperienced drivers. According to recent statistics there are over 250,000 inexperienced teen drivers in Georgia. Each year there are 5,500 teen driver fatalities nationwide. Teens, or parents of teens, can order the magnet to place on the back of a teen driver's car. This serves as a warning sign to other drivers that the person behind the wheel has recently started driving.

Did you know that two-thirds of teen driver crashes involve other motorists and passengers? Identifying "permit" and new drivers will not only save the lives of our young drivers, but all motorists.
